Meet Our New Director Adrianna Anderson

Have you met Hunter Street's new ministry directors? We would like to introduce you to these new faces in Street Talk over the next few weeks and tell you a little about their ministry.

In September, we introduced you to Ryan Gaines Hunter Street College Director. Today, get to know our new Ministry Director for Hunter Street Women, Adrianna Anderson.

Adrianna and her husband Gregory found themselves returning to Hunter Street after moving to Pinson, Alabama several years ago. When she saw Hunter Street was looking for a new Women's Ministry Director, she knew that call and her heart for women was leading her to this new step.

"I have a heart for women. I walk in our shoes," Adrianna

says. "My hope is to see every woman walk in the purpose for which they were created by our heavenly Father - growing closer to Jesus, serving others, telling the Good News, and worshiping God in how they live each day," she says. "Sometimes as women, we get caught up in the identities of being mother, wife, sister, aunt" she explains. "We often forget that God also calls us as individuals to serve Him, and he has a plan and purpose just for us."

As director, Adrianna says one aspect the ministry will focus on is encouraging women to use the gifts God has blessed them with to serve Him in many different ways.
